



## ENTRIES

1. Entry fees are shown below Section or Division Headings.
  2. One entry per person/per class, unless otherwise stated.
  3. All entries must be made on the entry form supplied by the CVEAFF. Only one exhibitor per entry form. Entry fees must accompany entry forms in a sealed envelope.
  4. Mail entry forms to: **CVEA Fall Fair**, 201-580 Duncan Ave, Courtenay BC, V9N 2M7. Mailed entry forms must be post marked on or before **August 13, 2007**.
  5. Deliver entries to: (1) Fall Fair Office, 580 Duncan Avenue, Courtenay (2) Black Creek Farm & Feed or (3) South Country Feeds. Closing date for delivering entries to these business is 12 noon **August 16, 2007**;
  6. **Deadline Exceptions: Hay** (deadline: August 9 for delivery to Fall Fair Barn) **Sheep** (deadline: August 12) **Flowers** (deadline is August 22 for delivery to the office); **4-H Entries** - (please see Section Y). Flower and 4-H entries delivered after noon August 16 must be delivered to the Fall Fair office.
7. **Late Entries are subject to double entry fees.**
  8. Exhibits are to be picked up between 5:15 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. Sunday, August 26. Exhibits not picked up at that time may be donated to charity.
  9. All exhibits must have been grown or made by the exhibitor within the last twelve months, unless not previously entered in the Fair, and unless otherwise stated.
  10. All livestock must be in the name of the said owner for at least one month prior to entry.

## EXHIBITS- (Please Note Times)

1. Home and Garden Arts exhibits will be received at the Curling Rink between 1:00 pm and 7:00 pm, Thursday, August 23, 2007, unless otherwise stated.
2. Flowers will be received between 9:00 am and 1:00 pm, Friday, August 24, 2007, unless otherwise stated.
3. Livestock will be received between 12:00 pm and 5:00 pm on Friday, August 24, 2007. All animals must be and will be vet checked.
4. **No exhibits can be collected or leave the Exhibition Grounds prior to 4:15 pm Sunday, August 26, 2007.**

## JUDGING

1. Any person interfering with or attempting to influence the Judges, or who shall on the Exhibition Grounds use abusive language towards the Judges, shall forfeit his/her right to any prize money to which he/she may otherwise have been entitled.
2. If there are at least three exhibits of a similar type entered in the "any other than listed" classes, a separate class may be created if the Judge thinks it is advisable.
3. Protests must be made in writing within 24 hours after the judges have delivered their decision. A \$10.00 deposit must accompany the protest, which will only be returned if the protest is upheld. Protests are to be submitted to the Fall Fair Office and directed to the President.

## AWARDS

1. Exhibits will not be awarded unless considered worthy of merit. First prize will only be considered at the discretion of the judge. **THE JUDGES DECISION IS FINAL.**
2. Exhibits will be judged and awarded cash prizes for 1st and 2nd. 3rd place exhibits will be awarded a ribbon only.
3. All Home & Garden Arts exhibits, except for Junior, Assisted Entry, and 4H, will be presented with sticker decals. Anyone wishing an "Old Fashioned" ribbon can ask a volunteer when collecting your exhibit on Sunday.
4. **All prize money (except 4H & Horse Club)** will be paid out at the Fair on Sunday, August 26th or at the Fair Office - Wed and Thu mornings until September 14, 2007. Monies not collected by that date will be considered a donation to the fair. (Call 338-8177 for an appointment if times are not suitable for you.)
5. Donated merchant prizes will be drawn from first prize winners except for Sections D, I, J and Y. These prizes will be displayed throughout the weekend and can be picked up at the close of the Fair or at the office during office hours until September 14, 2007. Prizes not collected by that date may revert back to the Fair.
6. All prize money over \$150.00 will be paid by cheque and mailed before September 30, 2007.
7. All cheques must be cashed by October 30, 2007. No reissuing of cheques will be undertaken. All certificates must be redeemed by December 31, 2007, unless otherwise stated.
8. Ribbons awarded by the Judges must be displayed during the Exhibition.

## ADMISSION

1. Admission to the grounds will be by: • admission ticket • CVEA Membership Card • CVEA Pass • CVEA Ribbon • 4-H Membership Card.
2. Any of the above entitles the holder to the unlimited entry to the Exhibit Hall and any attraction/event on the grounds. All passes must be obtained PRIOR to the Fair at the Fall Fair Office no later than Friday, August 24, 2007 at 1 pm.

## GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **GATES:** Saturday, August 25 - 8:45 am to 7:00 pm.. Sunday, August 26 - 8:45 am to 4:00 pm. Grounds are open for one hour after gates close.
2. **PARKING:** Permitted in designated areas only and under the direction of the attendants.
3. **MOVING VEHICLES:** Prohibited on the grounds during the open hours of the Fall Fair. Only vehicles transporting livestock and equipment are permitted entry at the gate situated at the intersection of Headquarters Road and Vanier Drive.
4. **DOGS:** **NOT** permitted, with the exception of Certified Assistance dogs and dogs in the World of Dogs. Dogs running at large will be impounded. Giving away or selling puppies, kittens or other animals is not permitted.
5. **SMOKING:** Permitted only in designated areas.
6. **ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES:** Consumption of alcoholic beverages is prohibited.
7. **FIREARMS, AMMUNITION & EXPLOSIVES:** Prohibited on the Exhibition Grounds, with the exception of those of the R.C.M.P.
8. **OVERNIGHT CAMPING:** permitted only by permission of the Fall Fair Office. **ALL CAMPERS MUST REGISTER.** Fees of \$6.plus GST, per night are payable in advance to the CFEA Fall Fair. Un-chaperoned minors are not permitted to camp.

## MISCELLANEOUS

1. Any exhibitor removing exhibits in any division of the Fair before 5:15 p.m. Sunday, August 26, without the permission of the Director-in-Charge, shall forfeit all prize money and prizes. Exhibitor Cards must be presented to the committee-in-charge before any exhibit is removed.
2. Sale of raffle tickets is restricted to rented booths only, and must meet with the approval of the CVEA. Organizations are responsible for their own lottery licenses.
3. "For Sale" signs are not permitted.
4. The Comox Valley Exhibition Association reserves the right to refuse anyone for cause. Any exhibitor who violates any of the **GENERAL RULES**, or any of the rules printed herein, shall be liable to forfeit any or all prize money and awards made to such exhibitor, and may also be barred from further competition for such a period as may be decided by the Directors.

## LIABILITIES AND OBLIGATIONS

1. Exhibitors of animals, machinery in motion, and other exhibits liable to cause accidents, injury, or damage to property, or to a person coming into contact with them, shall guard their exhibits and protect the public from coming in contact therewith, and every exhibitor shall indemnify the Association from and against all claims, demands, costs, charges, and expenses which may incur, suffer, or be put to, by reason of accident, or of any person properly guarded, or the public not being properly guarded there from.
2. Each exhibitor shall assume the responsibility for any injury occasioned to himself, or his assistants, while exhibiting or performing.
3. The Association will take all reasonable precaution to ensure the safety of exhibits sent to the Exhibition but the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting them, and should any exhibit, or portion thereof, be injured, lost or stolen, the Association **WILL NOT** be liable for the value thereof. Exhibit Buildings are under supervision during the hours that the Fair is open to the public. The buildings are locked at all other times.
